VPC Strategy Plan 2016 - 2020

The Council of the VPC is developing a Strategy Plan to advance organised philately and its clubs for the next five years. The seven basic questions are listed below.

Context: The VPC, like many other volunteer organisations, needs to plan and map out its purposes, and its strategies and measures to attain them. Similar organisations such as the Australian Philatelic Federation and the American Philatelic Society have undertaken a process to develop a Strategic Plan. Their circumstances are akin to those facing the VPC. The hobby, in terms of collector numbers, juniors taking up the hobby, the number of stamp clubs, and the number of stamp dealers, are all in decline. The VPC carries out a wide range of activities and its constitution and government regulations set out formal requirements of it. These issues and a number of others can only be addressed by a re-think in the approaches taken by the VPC and other affiliated bodies.

To assist the process the Council is very keen to get advice from clubs or individual collectors. If you would like to contribute your ideas to the discussion please respond.

- What should be the VISION where does the VPC want to end up?
- 2. What should be our MISSION why does the VPC exist?
- 3. What GOALS should be set to meet the VPC VISION and MISSION?
- 4. What specific targets should be set to achieve the agreed GOALS?

ROLES & ACTION PLANS

As part of this review the roles of the Executive and committee members are being considered so that each VPC member has specific activity areas to look after and report on, and an appropriate budget is allocated for each VPC task. The roles might be:

President: chair meetings, represent the VPC, liaison with the APF, meeting schedule,

Vice-President: exhibitions, exhibition rules, medals, frames, Awards of Merit, VPC judges, exhibition results

Secretary: meeting organisation and minutes, agendas, correspondence, VPC travel, liaison with RPSV, APTA liaison, annual returns, annual reports to AFF, club listings, APO liaison, VPC archives

Treasurer: finances, banking, investments, insurances, annual budget.

Member-Publications: VPC News, Liaison with APF News editor.

Member-Youth: Liaison with APF Youth Officer, Youth entry support for exhibitions, Junior competitions on APF website.

Member- Exhibition Support: Liaison with VPC Vice-President, Exhibition Planning Committee, Bin Room support.

Member-Publications Support: assist Publications Officer.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

National and International Exhibitions

APF has responsibility for exhibitions at these levels, but the VPC should contribute to these with financial and personnel support. The level of financial support should be cost neutral as far as possible, but should include some winners' trophies. When these exhibitions are held in Melbourne the VPC should enlist volunteers to assist.

VICPEX: The VPC conducts a state-wide exhibition annually. This includes both single frame and multi-frame entries. The venue will be, as far as possible, at alternate city/country venues.

Regional

The VPC will support the organisation of region-based exhibitions, where local clubs are prepared to conduct and organise them. VPC support will include a repayable funding advance, certificates and medals, publicity through the VPC, and assistance with judging and an exhibitor workshop.

AWARD OF MERIT

Awards of Merit may be made by the Victorian Philatelic Council (VPC) at its Annual Congress.

Access is by nomination by the Committee of an affiliated Society of the VPC, or by the VPC Council. An Award is not limited to members of affiliated Societies.

PROCEDURE

Nomination in writing must be forwarded to the Secretary of the VPC under sealed cover, and are to be considered confidential until the award is announced at Congress.

Nominations will be considered by a special Committee before Congress. The Committee shall consist of the President, Secretary and Treasurer of the VPC at the time. If one of these Officers wishes to be disqualified, for personal or discretionary reasons, the vacancy will be filled by a Vice-President.

The decision of the Committee is final.

DUE DATE

Nominations must be forwarded to the Secretary one month before Congress.

GUIDANCE FOR NOMINATIONS

Guide lines indicated below are those which will be observed by the Award of Merit Committee, and are quoted as guidance for those wishing to submit nominations.

It must be emphasised that the guidelines apply particularly to service to the hobby as a whole. Work limited or known only to a single Society should be honoured by that Society itself, rather than by the VPC. Nevertheless, some special circumstance may extend the effort to a wider field, or the effort may of such outstanding and exceptional value as to merit consideration.

Full supporting details regarding each applicable item below must be quoted.

- Service to the hobby as a whole.
- Research or development of philatelic knowledge.
- Lectures, displays, writing of general philatelic value and interest.
- Organisation (of a Society, public philatelic occasions).
- Length of service, consistency or outstanding effort for philatelic organisations.
- Encouragement of beginners.

Possession of a remarkable collection or of valuable philatelic material does not qualify for this award.

Remembering a Melbourne Philatelic Icon

The philatelic community of Melbourne is mourning one of its true icons following the death last month of Max Stern. Born in Slovakia, Stern began philately as a student, helping support his family by selling stamps. With Jews in Nazi- occupied Bratislava prohibited from owning businesses, Stern transferred his business to a non-Jew who obtained forged papers for him. But he was sent to a labour camp in Zilina in 1943 and was readied for transport to Auschwitz, yet eluded authorities.

On Yom Kippur 1944, the Nazis rounded up Bratislava's Jews, and Stern's family was later sent to Auschwitz. Stern himself hid with friends, but was captured and taken to Sachsenhausen concentration camp. Near the war's end, he was on a death march towards Berlin.

While two sisters survived, his parents, two younger brothers and most of his aunts and uncles perished.

In 1948, Stern married survivor Eva Rosenthal and they immigrated to Australia, where he founded Max Stern & Co in the Port Philip Arcade in Flinders Street, Melbourne. He later wrote an autobiography – *My Stamp On Life*.

In 2010, Max Stern & Co partnered with B'nai B'rith's Raoul Wallenberg Unit to issue stamps honouring the Swedish diplomat who saved tens of thousands of Jews.

The great-grandfather, who was a Member of the Order of Australia (AM), last year told *The Australia Jewish News* that because of his 14 great-grandchildren, "I know I have truly survived."

We all have our favourite stories of Max, and for my part I found him incredibly kind, helpful, and willing to spend time imparting his enormous knowledge to his customers. We will all miss him enormously.

It's not too late!

In our December issue we invited all philatelist to submit their entries for VICPEX 2016 to be held in Maryborough on 23 April. As was noted there, both a state level one frame competition and state level competitive classes will be featured. We also included copies of the rules governing these competitions and an entry form. The good news is that it is still not too late to get your entries in - the closing date is not until Friday 15 April! So why not get busy putting your prized collection into a form that will show it to its best advantage and submit your entry form to the conference organisers? Country exhibitions are always so much fun, and you will get double the enjoyment if you are able to show off your collection. I can attest from my own experience that the philatelic experience is greatly enhanced if you take the time and effort to prepare an exhibition or to write an article for one of the numerous philatelic journal about some aspect of your collection. The first step is to to see how more experienced collectors prepare their exhibits so please join us in Mayborough for a great day out and see how the experts do it!




